## Grade K-1

### *Pioneer Programs*

#### **My Pioneer Family (Soc. St. 1.2)**

Use our Settler's Cabin as a historical resource, to show how families of the past have affected and influenced family life today.

#### **Pioneer Field Day (Soc. St. 1.2)**

Use artefacts, games, and homemade treats to differentiate between current activities and events of long ago.

#### **Snapshots Through Time (Soc. St. 1.1 & 1.2)**

Use Stony Plain's murals, to appreciate how stories and events of the past connect their families and communities to the present.

#### **Terra to Table (Sci. Topic E)**

Grind wheat to make muffins and in the process identify how animals, plants and humans depend on each other for food.

Recognize and identify the basic needs and interactions of animals, plants and insects and their role within the food chain.

#### **Alberta Café! (Health W-1.5)\***

Use the Canada Food Guide to recognize the importance of basic healthy nutritional choices, practice reading food labels and explore the benefits of eating locally grown foods.

Use our current gallery exhibition to observe and reflect on artistic style, and express their creativity through different mediums.

## Grade 2

Recreate the events of a prairie one-room school, field day through games, toys, races, and homemade treats.

#### **Snapshots Through Time (Soc. St. 2.2)**

Use Stony Plain's murals, to analyse how the contributions of individuals and groups helped our community emerge.

#### **Alberta Storytellers Bring History to Life (Soc.St. 2.2)**

Appreciate the stories of the past as told by local seniors, who use the award winning *Multi-Heritage Kits*.
